

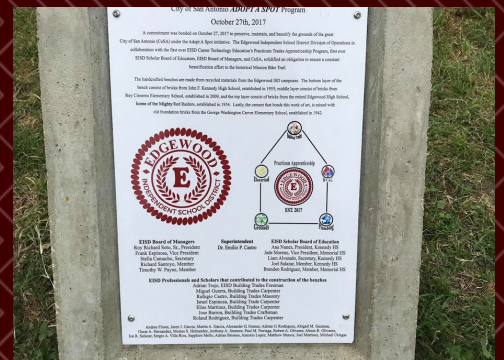

TEEN BOARD

PURPOSE: The Edgewood Independent School District Teen Board serves a unique and important role in Edgewood Independent School District as an internal organization that provides a platform for high school leaders to advocate for their peers at the school and district level. We enhance the performance of our schools by:

- Promoting student voice and leadership
- Building powerful relationships among students and between students and adults
- Creating a positive school environment
- Fostering our school and district goals

GUIDELINES:

- Teen Board will be comprised of seven, 10th - 12th grade representatives from the two high school campuses (One representative per grade level, per campus).
- The seventh board member will be selected by the Superintendent of Schools, based on submission and review of a recommendation letter by an external source.
- Teen Board will meet on the 2nd Tuesday of the month for leadership and project management training at the District Conference Center from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.
- Members will regularly engage with school district representatives, including the Superintendent and SLT, during these meetings.
- The Teen Board will collaborate with the Board of Trustees and make presentations four times a year.

EXPECTATIONS AND OUTCOMES:

- Members should serve as the representative voice for their peers and share out recommendations for programming, changes that they feel would benefit their classroom experience and concerns they hear, through submission of agenda items.
- Members are expected to develop and implement one capstone project for the year that addresses a topic of concern to the Board and proposes a solution. This work will be presented to the SLT and Board of Trustees for consideration.
- In an effort to promote transparency, meeting agendas and minutes will be posted on the "Student," under the "Teen Board" link on the district website for others to access.
- Meeting reminders will be sent via email to all representatives two weeks before the meeting.
